Safeguarding Policy

Aldwych Speed Club (the Club) is committed to ensuring that all young people and vulnerable adults who skate have a safe and positive experience. The Club is committed to developing and implementing policies and procedures which ensure that everyone knows and accepts their responsibility in relation to a duty of care for young people and vulnerable adults. The Club recognises that it is not the responsibility of those individuals working within the Club to determine if abuse has taken place, but it is their responsibility to act upon and report any concerns.

The Club and those involved with the Club will abide by the following principles and statements:

- All people within Aldwych Speed Club, regardless of age, gender, race, religion, sexual orientation, ability or disability, have the right to be protected.
- All people participating in sport have a right to do so in a safe environment.
- Adults working at Aldwych Speed Club will provide a safe, positive and fun sporting experience for young people and vulnerable adults.
- Adults – volunteers, coaches and officials will understand and be supported in their role and responsibility with regard to the Duty of Care for young people and vulnerable adults.
- All suspicions and allegations will be taken seriously, managed and dealt with swiftly and appropriately.
- It is the responsibility of the child protection experts to determine whether or not abuse has taken place, but it is the responsibility of all those working within Aldwych Speed Club to report any concerns.
- The Club will assist coaches, volunteers and officials to remain up-to-date with the latest Safeguarding issues.
- The Club will appoint a Welfare and Safety Officer who will be responsible for issues concerning welfare at the Club.
- The Club will carry out regular risk assessments to ensure the safety of young people, vulnerable adults and all members of the Club.
